As of 10pm 2/28/07, it appears they are not yet scheduled for a hearing, but that can change at any moment. We will probably discuss these at future meetings.



# **ASK THE LAWYER**

# **QUESTION:**

My tenant lost his job and failed to pay rent this month. He gave me a voucher from the City that promises to pay the full amount owed within the next couple of weeks. Do I have to accept the voucher or can I evict this tenant?

ANSWER: Title 14 § 6002; General Assistance Vouchers

In these circumstances, State Law provides that the voucher is a payment equivalent to the amount promised in the voucher. Title 14 §6002 states that "Payment or written assurance of payment through the General Assistance Program (of the State or a Municipality) has the same effect as payment in cash".

In some instances the State (DHS), a City or Town may give the tenant a check payable to the landlord as emergency General Assistance in order to prevent the eviction of a tenant, or to stop an eviction which may have already been commenced by the landlord under a 7-day Notice to Quit for non-payment of rent. In these cases, the check can be promptly deposited and be used by the landlord just like any other payment by check.

More often, the City will issue a "voucher" which promises to pay a specific stated sum, but actual payment may not be received by the landlord for a couple of weeks. Nonetheless, the landlord must accept the City's "promise to pay" just as though the tenant has made a cash payment and the landlord should provide the tenant with a written receipt in exchange for the voucher just like any other cash payment.

Furthermore, since the City's promise to pay in the near future has to be treated the same as cash, that "payment" can serve to cure a default of non-payment and reinstate the tenancy under a 7-day Notice to Quit for non-payment of rent where the eviction is already pending in the Court.

From a purely legal standpoint, I wonder whether this law results in an unconstitutional "taking" of private property by a governmental entity since the landlord cannot promptly pay the landlord's bills with the City's future promise to pay, but the landlord is required to give immediate value to the tenant. Nonetheless, this is the status of the State Law and the landlord must accept the City's voucher, the same as a cash payment.

A City voucher issued on behalf of a tenant normally occurs in the context of an immediate emergency and is not generally made available to the tenant on an ongoing basis like the Section 8 Program or other forms of subsidized housing, which are entirely different.

Next month I will address the pro, cons and pitfalls of subsidized housing such as the Section 8 Program.
